Belden House & Mews revives Connecticut's hospitality heritage





In a <u>town that went more than 100 years without a real hotel</u>, <u>Belden House & Mews</u> arrives looking fully formed. Troutbeck's team and Champalimaud Design knit together an 1888 Victorian mansion and a 1959 modernist wing so neither feels like the annex. Belden House charms with its stained glass, mantels and parquet; the Mews answers with Breuer chairs, grasscloth and saturated textiles. Local makers get top billing, from lan Ingersoll's four-posters to Dumais Made lamps and Bantam Tileworks ceramics. A serious spa, chef Tyler Heckman's farm-and-coast menu, butler service and a house BMW reimagines what "country inn" means in New England.
